"What stuff?"

"Well, last year, when we were picking subjects for senior, he told us to do what we loved and then we would love what we do. This year, he gave us a strategy for achieving our goals."

As a parent, I also took the opportunity to attend the Parent Information evening. Again, informative and entertaining with clear messages.
